



Survey Respondents




Total number of respondents was 236; multiple job titles may have been checked.

- Other 2% (6)




Hazardous Duty Pay...




Only 3% of the paid responders indicated that they receive compensation or other benefits above their regular pay for responding to radiation / hazmat incidents.

Survey Results - Training




Reflects the 5 levels of OSHA / EPA haz mat training requirements. Some respondents checked more than one box.

99 answered yes.


•Have you attended training that included information about the WIPP Transportation Program?

Survey Results



Only 27% of the people surveyed indicated that they had participated in a drill or exercise as part of training.

28% of EMTs and FireFighters felt adequately trained to handle a radioactively contaminated patient.

Out of the 236 Surveys completed, 61% indicated that they would respond.


Will You Personally Respond to Hazardous Materials Incident?

Does your department/agency carry workers compensation and/or injury insurance for you as a responder?







Approximately 85% of EMS/Fire Departments are insured.

Survey Results


 Only 25% of EMS and fire department personnel think they have adequate equipment for hazardous materials or radioactive materials incident response.

Survey Results: 75% of EMS/Fire Departments that require equipment or training are volunteer services



Most respondents want more equipment and training.



Summary/Recommendations

- Because of the high turnover rate of EMS, Fire and Hospital Personnel, training should be updated at least every 2 years.
- Equipment for a HazMat/Radioactive response should be inspected annually and replaced when needed or required.

Summary/Recommendations

- Joint exercises should be conducted on a regular basis by EMS, fire, law enforcement and hospital personnel to be prepared.
- IP & EMS Bureau will conduct a survey every 2 years about New Mexico's state of medical preparedness for a HazMat or radioactive materials incident.
